It's my honour and privilege to share with you reflections and great news that God has blessed us with over the past year.

2021 has been a year of unprecedented growth. We saw the ministry add 20 fulltime employees as our work flourished in Canada, the US, the UK, and Australasia. We also started conversations with individuals passionate about parish renewal in Germany and South Africa, to begin the discernment process about whether we might be called to invest further in their regions. Despite the challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, we were able to resume limited international travel and began to offer hybrid events where online offerings were combined with support for small groups gathering in person. The creativity in finding ways to gather during the pandemic has greatly expanded our audience and been an incredible blessing for the ministry.

We have also seen interest from Bishops and Archbishops grow exponentially. From the first cohort of Bishops in group coaching to generous invitations to speak with priests at archdiocesan gatherings, we've expanded our reach in collaboration with Bishops and Archbishops over the past year. These key relationships have helped us reach a wider audience and connected us with leaders who want to see transformation across their diocese.

As we look forward to 2022, there's much to be excited about - from a return to ingatherings person to deepened relationships with colleagues in Germanspeaking countries to a continued rise in priest participation in both group and onecoaching. Divine on-one Renovation Ministry continues to inspire pastors, connect them with other like-minded priests, and equip them with the tools they need to transform their parishes into thriving communities that help people fall in love with Jesus. I'm so grateful for everyone who pitches in to make this important work happen.

We do this by hosting events and developing resources where priests and lay leaders are given a platform to share inspiring stories of transformation in their parishes.


In 2020, the number of priests engaged with Divine Renovation was approximately 900. In 2021, that number **doubled to 1,800**. The number of bishops engaging with our ministry also **grew by 68%**.






2022 marks Father Paddy's 50th anniversary of ordination. He feels more inspired in his priesthood now than ever.

"My engagement with Divine Renovation has set me on a plane and a path of renewal that I've never had in my priesthood. And it has impacted me... to the point that never ever, in my life as a priest, have I been, as I am now, so excited to be a priest." Father Paddy became one of the early adopters with DR five years ago and has been in coaching ever since.

The fruit of renewal is evident in his parish. "I've come into a parish that has a great history...Now we've come with the culture of Divine Renovation and discipleship on mission."

"I'm beginning to see that right now there is a definite shift."

Father Paddy goes on to say, being a Pastor "can be a very lonely place." But now as he leads out of his Senior Leadership Team, "what I find most liberating, most encouraging and exciting is that when I work out of a team, it also lifts up the leadership of the laity and that is wonderfully hopeful for the life of the Church."

Emily first got connected to DR when she was living in East Malaysia and went to a conference in Kuala Lumpur where Father James Mallon was streamed in for a breakout session. His message of moving from maintenance to mission resonated with her deeply.

Upon returning to her home diocese of Auckland in 2020, her parish priest, Father Austen, hadn't only heard about the book Divine Renovation: From a Maintenance to a Missional Parish, but was about to meet with a group of his brother priests and Auxiliary Bishop Michael Gielen (now Bishop of Christchurch) for a book study.

With a strong desire to be a "fly on the wall", Emily asked if she could join the discussion. "I really want to be a part of that because our priests still need us," says Emily. After that she leapt right into helping her parish with renewal – volunteering as a leader for their parish's evangelization program.

Father Dario has been a priest for over 40 years and had grown content with being in maintenance mode. But with Pope Francis' Evangelii Gaudium, "I have been renewing my perspectives with greater openness."

This led him to connect with DR: "He [Father James] transmits a concrete experience of parish renewal."

In 2021, Father Dario started group coaching with DR. One of the key changes for him is "having to lead as a team with others and dream together...it has been an extraordinary experience: we meet without fail weekly, eat together, talk about the parish, review together and distribute the work to everyone."

EQUIP

In this movement of parishes becoming missional, parish leaders are the protagonists.

As a guide, Divine Renovation exists to equip and support parish leaders for the work of mission.

Through our coaching programs, events, and resources, we equip parishes and their leaders to pursue mission by helping them live out the three principles or keys to parish renewal:

- 1. The primacy of evangelization
- 2. Having the best of leadership principles
- 3. A radical reliance on the power of the Holy Spirit



On topics that help parishes go further in mission, our events were attended by over 9,600 parish leaders from around the world.

Father John is a busy man. He says his current placement is "certainly my most challenging appointment." The challenges are clear: a country moving away from the church, too few priests and burn out looming for those who take up the call.

In 2018, Fr. John heard about DR at a conference in Ireland and felt "this is a road we want to take." Since going through group coaching he finds, "working with the team the last couple of years has been super, having that support and unity of vision."

With DR's help, he is uniting the two parishes, forming a single parish leadership team, and empowering the laity. Empowering his people has been a joy, encouraging them to "look at the gifts that you have, don't be hiding them or afraid of them."

"It's a time of excitement and challenge because in some ways this is the biggest moment in the Irish church since Catholic emancipation...the beginning of building something for the future"

Speaking with Cathy, St. Declan's Director of Evangelization, it is clear they are focused on equipping people to be on mission. "With DR ...we are creating a place ...where [people] can come together and they can really encounter Jesus."

One of the focuses of the parish is to disciple new leaders through identifying their giftings and placing them in positions that allow them to flourish as they further the missional calling of the Church. "One of the great stories of grace through all of this... God has been so faithful that even in the midst of challenges we've got ministries starting and growing, and people moving into new places of ministry...there is fruitfulness that blows our minds!"





Where do we go from here?

In the last few decades, religious disaffiliation has been rising while the number of self-identifying Catholics has been declining — and among those who do, the critical markers for religious practice show a concerning trend. In Canada, for example, Canadian Catholics who attend Mass at least once a month has dropped at a staggering rate: from 56% in 1985, to 12% in 2022.

Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (cf. John 10:10). Now, more than ever, people need every opportunity to hear the life-giving Gospel of Jesus.


And in order to do so, as a Church, we simply cannot rely on the models and practices that were best suited for a time in the Church's life that has since passed.

We believe that the local parish is the normative place where people can encounter Jesus. Hence, parishes must labour to give evangelization a priority in parish life. After all, Jesus didn't give the Church a mission; He gave His mission a Church.

We believe that when 16% — that is, 35,000 — of parishes around the world live out their missionary identity, that will be the tipping point that will motivate all others. As a ministry, Divine Renovation is committed to seeing that become a reality, and we exist as a guide to help parishes answer this call to mission.

Andy St. John Bosco & St. Bernadette Parish, UK

Andy is focused on mission.

Andy is also a monthly donor to DR.

He wants to equip others for the journey to renew their parishes.

Andy and his wife have always been deeply involved with the Catholic Church, their local parish and living out their faith. As Andy puts it, he feels like he has been waiting since Vatican II to see the Church be on fire, when he came into contact with DR he felt relief: "finally, someone is doing something about parish renewal."

In 2018 he attended the DR conference in Halifax, and felt a resurgence of hope, experiencing the renewal at Saint Benedict Parish. During the conference he was able to stay with a host family, attend a small group

and experience the vibrancy of the parish. "It was just absolutely fantastic."

He chooses to partner with DR financially for two reasons:

- 1.DR coached his parish and priest, and he has experienced first-hand the fruit of moving a parish from maintenance to mission.
- 2. He now wants other parishes to have the opportunity to experience the same renewal. When his parish started with DR in 2017, there was a fee. The cost for services was a barrier to many parishes, especially smaller ones.

In 2021 DR moved to be donor-funded. Now donors like Andy enable any parish to get the support they need from DR.

For Andy, being a monthly donor is part of being missional.




