- evaluating and elevating remote webcam presenters (lighting, composition and sound)
- providing remote production support on various online events (basic IT support and AV)
- analyzing and creating visual summary graphics to support video presentations
- reviewing B-roll and export to our stock library
- · tag and file our best stuff for easy access

Casual dress is okay by us. This can be a fully remote-working position with support and team contact through Microsoft Teams but, if you're near HRM, we'd be happy to invite you to in-person meetings and social events.
